Dear Architecture School Librarians:

The 1989 Annual Association of Architecture School Librarians (AASL) will be held on March 4-7, 1989 at The Drake Hotel in Chicago, Illinois. The AASL meeting will be held, as usual, in conjunction with the Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture (ACSA) 77th annual meeting.

The conference registration will be held Saturday, March 4, 1989 beginning at 10:00 a.m. The first event will be the ACSA welcoming session, followed by the keynote speaker for the ASCA program. Afterwards we will have a welcoming session by the President of the AASL, Jocelyn Spratley of Hampton University.

I have planned what I hope will be an interesting and useful four day conference. There will be discussions on periodical indexes for architecture school libraries, collection development problems, grant-seeking, and special collections in an architecture library. Due to the important role Chicago has played in the development of architecture, and the multitude of things to see and do here, it has been difficult deciding what to include. I hope I have selected properly and that you find your visit not only educational, but interesting, useful, and also fun. Our tentative schedule includes a walking tour on Sunday afternoon of the Chicago loop (wear WARM clothes and comfortable shoes!) highlighting both old and new architecture, a visit on Monday to the Frank Lloyd Wright Home and Studio in Oak Park, and a tour on Tuesday morning of the architecture archives in the Burnham Library of the Art Institute of Chicago. Many of these visits will include stops at special bookstores. Also included will be our business meeting and two ACSA receptions. On Tuesday afternoon there will be an opportunity to attend one of four ACSA Workshop Tours (not included in our registration).

I hope to see you all in the Windy City on March 4th. Don't hesitate to write or call for more information.

The Drake Hotel The special ACSA conference rates will range

The Air Express Continental Air Transport Co. provides very frequent bus service from O'Hare to the Drake for \$9.75 one-way and from Midway for \$7.50 one-way (round-trip discount available).

The Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) provides service from O'Hare to the city for \$1.00. To get to the Drake Hotel get a transfer for another \$.25, transfer from the train at the Chicago Ave. station, take the Chicago Ave. bus EAST to Michigan Ave. and transfer to any bus going NORTH for 4 blocks.

Signs directing to both services should be found on the lower level of the terminal building.

It is possible to share a cab ride from O'Hare to the Loop area for a set fee. The customary fee for a cab ride to the Loop area is in the range of \$25 to \$30 depending on the time of day.

The Drake Hotel is in the Gold Coast area just North of the Loop.
