Dear AASL Members and Friends,



Conference dates are March 12-15, and the site is the Queen Elizabeth Hotel.

The conference theme, "Information Technology and the Role of the Academic Architecture Librarian", affords many interesting and informative programs. Presentations on electronic resources, interactive bibliographic instruction, and imaging technology are planned, as well as several great tours. We will be visiting the Canadian Centre for Architecture Library and Archive, and the Blackader/Lauterman Library of Architecture and Art at McGill University. For the tough and hearty, we have also planned a walking tour of the historic Vieux Montreal--bring your boots and hats! The enclosed program schedule has a complete listing of AASL activities.

The Queen Elizabeth Hotel is located at the base of McGill College in the heart of Montreal.
